The representation of Imacu Limited, Michael William Forrest, exercising the profession of chartered accountant under the name and style of Michael Forrest and Partners, and Johan Georges Lampaert.

DEPUTY BAILIFF: The Court is minded not to hear any further evidence at this stage, to send the matter formally to proof, with written pleadings being entered on both sides. We accept that if affidavit or other evidence is admitted from Mr. Habin and his clients, that the Crown should have the opportunity to recall or put in new evidence. In fact, we will virtually start again. In the meantime of course, the stay will have to continue.

DEPUTY BAILIFF: Very well, the matter is sent to proof. Full pleadings will be entered by both sides. All evidence that either side wish to adduce will be heard by the Court, but the whole record to date will remain. In the meantime, the stay will continue, and the parties will fix a date in chambers for the further hearing.
