JUDGMENT

THE BAILIFF: Saunders, you have had every chance; you appealed from your sentence of 6 weeks imposed by the learned Police Court Magistrate and the Court took account of the facts and substituted the probation order with community service. You have failed to respond to your community service order for no good or apparent reason and therefore you have forfeited the opportunity which we gave you by not sending young people to prison. I am afraid you are the author of your own misfortune. You have chosen not to take advantage of what the Court offered you on your appeal and you must pay the penalty. Therefore, there will be a sentence on each of the counts of one month concurrent with each other

and consecutive to the Police Court sentence. Mr. Renouf, you will have your legal aid costs.
