1745. *January 18.* ——— *against* FREEHOLDERS of RENFREW.

UPON a complaint against some freeholders in the shire of Renfrew, claiming votes in the election of a Member of Parliament,

THE LORDS found, That a retour of several lands valued together, mentioning the several values in the descriptive clause, and only the sum total in the *valent*, which sum agreed with the particulars in the description, was a sufficient evidence of the value of these particular lands.
