ENGLISH double bond, one having pleaded in defence against it, *quod solvit ad diem*, being more than 20 years from the term of payment; and this being overruled upon certain circumstances; he pleaded next *non est factum*; but the Lords found that plea not now competent, after he had pleaded the other and it had been overruled.
