**The Healthcare Improvement Scotland (Transfer of Property)  
Order 2011**

*Made* - - - - *22nd February 2011*

*Laid before the Scottish Parliament* *24th February 2011*

*Coming into force* - - *31st March 2011*

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 132(1) of the Public Services Reform (Scotland) Act 2010(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

**Citation and commencement**

1. This Order may be cited as the Healthcare Improvement Scotland (Transfer of Property) Order 2011 and comes into force on 31st March 2011.

**Transfer of Property held by NHS Quality Improvement Scotland to Healthcare Improvement Scotland**

2. On 1st April 2011 all property, rights and liabilities to which NHS Quality Improvement Scotland(b) was entitled or subject immediately before that date transfer to and vest in Healthcare Improvement Scotland(c).

(b) NHS Quality Improvement Scotland is a Special Health Board constituted by article 3 of the NHS Quality Improvement Scotland Order 2002 (S.S.I. 2002/534). "Special Health Board" is defined in section 108 of the National Health Service (Scotland) Act 1978 (c.29) ("the 1978 Act").
