ROADS AND BRIDGES

The A82 Trunk Road (Ba Bridge, Rannoch Moor) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011

Made - - - - 27th October 2011

Coming into force - - 9th November 2011

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 62(1) of the Road (Scotland) Act 1984^(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 62(1) of that Act, they are of the opinion that considerations of public safety and convenience require that traffic should be prohibited on the length of road specified in the Schedule to Order.

They have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A82 Trunk Road (Ba Bridge, Rannoch Moor) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011, comes into force on 9th November 2011 and ceases to have effect at 0001 hours on 16th November 2011.

Temporary prohibition of use of a road

2. No person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order, when such prohibition is identified as applying to any part or parts of that length of road by means of one or more of the traffic signs prescribed in Diagram 7010.1 and 7105 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002^(b).

Exemptions for emergency and works vehicles

3. This Order does not apply to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes, or a vehicle while being used in connection with the placing of the required signage.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

That length of the A82 Dalnottar - Inverness Trunk Road, from a point 4.856 kilometres or thereby south of Ba Bridge at the parking layby/viewpoint south of Creagan Criche, to a point 6.518 kilometres or thereby north of Ba Bridge at the access road to the Glencoe Mountain Resort and Ski Centre, a distance of 11.374 kilometres or thereby.
