ROAD TRAFFIC

The A96 Trunk Road (Elgin) (40 mph Speed Limit) Order 2011

Made

28th January 2011

Coming into force

7th February 2011

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 84(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

They have complied with Part II of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987(b).

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A96 Trunk Road (Elgin) (40 mph Speed Limit) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 7th February 2011.

Restriction of Speed

2. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 mph on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

That length of the A96 Aberdeen-Inverness Trunk Road 50 metres or thereby east of its junction with Pinefield Parade eastwards, for a distance of 806 metres or thereby.
