ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A83 Trunk Road (Arrochar) (Temporary Prohibition on
Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 2022**

Made - - - - *11th April 2022*

Coming into force - - *14th April 2022*

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1) and (2), 4(1) and 14(1)(b) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(b) of that Act, they are satisfied that traffic on the length of road specified in the schedule should be restricted or prohibited because of the likelihood of danger to the public, or of serious damage to the road, which is not attributable to works.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A83 Trunk Road (Arrochar) (Temporary Prohibition on Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 2022, comes into force on 14 April 2022 and ceases to have effect on 14 November 2022.

Prohibition on waiting, loading and unloading

2. No person may use, or permit the use of, any vehicle to—

- (a) wait at any time on the length of road, or a part or parts of the length of road, specified in the schedule of this Order when a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or a part or parts of that length of road, by means of the traffic sign of the type described in item 1 (diagram 1018.1 – (a) waiting of vehicles prohibited at all times or (b) stopping of vehicles in a layby prohibited except in emergency) of the sign table in Part 4 of schedule 7 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016(b), or
- (b) wait, load or unload on the length of road, or a part or parts of the length of road, specified in the schedule of this Order when a prohibition is identified as applying to that

length of road, or a part or parts of that length of road, by means of one or both of the traffic signs of the type described in item 19 (diagram 636 – temporary prohibition of waiting except for loading and unloading) and item 20 (diagram 636.1 – temporary prohibition of loading and unloading) of the sign table in Part 6 of schedule 13 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016.

Exemptions

3. No prohibition imposed by this Order applies to a vehicle being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

SPECIFIED LENGTH OF ROAD

That length of the A83 Tarbet – Lochgilphead – Campbeltown trunk road at Arrochar from a point 445 metres or thereby north of its junction with the A814, Arrochar to a point 1.666 kilometres or thereby south west of its junction with the entrance to the Succoth car park, a distance of 2.34 kilometres or thereby.
