ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A77 Trunk Road (Ballantrae) (Temporary Prohibition on
Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 2024**

Made - - - - *15th February 2024*

Coming into force - - *26th February 2024*

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1) and (2), 4(1) and 14(1)(a) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(a) of that Act, they are satisfied that traffic on the lengths of road specified in the schedule should be restricted or prohibited because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near those lengths of road.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the A77 Trunk Road (Ballantrae) (Temporary Prohibition on Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 2024 comes into force on 26 February and ceases to have effect on 28 February 2024.

Prohibition on waiting, loading and unloading.

2. No person may use, or permit the use of, any vehicle to wait, load or unload on the lengths of road, or a part or parts of the lengths of road, specified in the schedule when a prohibition is identified as applying to those lengths of road, or a part or parts of those lengths of road, by means of one or both of the traffic signs of the type described in item 19 (diagram 636 – temporary prohibition of waiting except for loading and unloading) and item 20 (diagram 636.1 – temporary prohibition of loading and unloading) of the sign table in Part 6 of schedule 13 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016(b).

The Scottish Ministers are the traffic authority by virtue of section 121A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (inserted by the 1991 Act, schedule 8, paragraph 70 and amended by S.I. 2001/1400) as read with section 151(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 (c. 54) (relevantly amended by S.I. 2001/1400). The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c. 46).

Exemptions

3. No prohibition imposed by this Order applies to—

- (a) a vehicle being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes, or
- (b) a vehicle being used for carrying out the works.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

SPECIFIED LENGTHS OF ROAD

- 1.** That length of the M77/A77 Glasgow – Stranraer Trunk Road in Ballantrae, being the north and southbound carriageways from a point outside Number 26 Main Street, to a point outside Number 31 Main Street, a distance of 35 metres or thereby.
- 2.** That length of the M77/A77 Glasgow – Stranraer Trunk Road in Ballantrae, being the north and southbound carriageways from a point outside Number 33 Main Street, to a point outside Number 53 Main Street, a distance of 60 metres or thereby.
- 3.** That length of the M77/A77 Glasgow – Stranraer Trunk Road being the north and southbound carriageways from a point outside Ballantrae Parish Church, to a point outside Kings Arms Hotel, a distance of 120 metres or thereby.
