In this case their Lordships see no reason to disturb the conclusions of the Court from which the appeal is brought.

There is undoubtedly strong documentary evidence of the separation of the two brothers. Each of them has obtained decrees of the Court on the footing of that separation, and, though it might be possible to explain their having done so, still, the only person who knows anything about it is the appellant, and he did not at the trial think fit to go into the box and explain matters.

Under these circumstances, it appears to their Lordships that it would be wrong to disturb the findings of the Court below. They will therefore humbly advise His Majesty that the appeal should be dismissed. As the respondents have not appeared, there will be no order as to costs.
