1981 CHAPTER 11

An Act to extend the circumstances in which complaints about consular actions can be made under the Parliamentary Commissioner Act 1967. [15th April 1981]

E IT ENACTED by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

- 1. Section 6(4) of the Parliamentary Commissioner Act 1967 Extension of (which restricts the circumstances in which complaints can be circumstances entertained under that Act by reference to the residence of the in which person aggrieved in the United Kingdom or the connection with about the United Kingdom of the action complained of) shall be consular amended by the insertion at the beginning of the words "Except actions can as provided in subsection (5) below" and the addition at the end under the of the following subsection—

 - (a) the complaint relates to action taken in any country 1967 c. 13. or territory outside the United Kingdom by an officer (not being an honorary consular officer) in the exercise of a consular function on behalf of the Government of the United Kingdom; and

(b) the person aggrieved is a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies who, under section 2 of the Immigration Act 1971, has the right of abode in the United Kingdom".

Short title and extent.

- 2.—(1) This Act may be cited as the Parliamentary Commissioner (Consular Complaints) Act 1981.
 - (2) This Act extends to Northern Ireland.
