WILD BIRDS

The Wild Birds (Sunday in Anglesey) Order 1963

Made - - - - 8th October 1963
Coming into Operation 1st November 1963

In pursuance of the power conferred on me by section 2(2) and (5) of the Protection of Birds Act 1954(a), I hereby make the following Order:—

1. The administrative county of Anglesey shall be a prescribed area for the purpose of section 2(2) of the Protection of Birds Act 1954.
2. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds (Sunday in Anglesey) Order 1963 and shall come into operation on 1st November 1963.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

Under section 2(2) of the Protection of Birds Act 1954, any wild bird included in Schedule 3 to the Act may be killed or taken in England or Wales on any day outside the close season for that bird except on Sundays in areas prescribed by order of the Secretary of State. This Order prescribes for this purpose the administrative county of Anglesey, and accordingly it will be an offence to kill or take or attempt to kill or take any wild bird included in Schedule 3 to the Act on Sundays in that county.
