**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Hullavington)
Regulations 2010**

Made - - - - - *3rd September 2010*

Coming into force - - - - - *7th September 2010*

The Secretary of State deems it necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Hullavington, Wiltshire by reason of trial flights of a captive balloon to be used for military broadcasting purposes.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 161 of the Air Navigation Order 2009(a).

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Hullavington) Regulations 2010 and come into force on 7th September 2010.
2. In regulation 3 all times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time.
3. —(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 0700 hours and 1900 hours on each day beginning with 7 September and ending on 15 September 2010, no aircraft is to fly below 6,000 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 1.5 nautical miles whose centre is at 513150N 0020854W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying—

 - (a) in accordance with an air traffic clearance issued by the air traffic control unit at either RAF Lyneham or Bristol Airport; or
 - (b) with the permission of the officer in charge of 2 Signal Squadron (Volunteers), 2 (National Communications) Signals Brigade detachment at Hullavington.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations introduce restrictions on flying in the vicinity of Hullavington, Wiltshire during the trial flights of a captive balloon to be used for military broadcasting purposes.
