ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A38 Trunk Road (Little Eaton to M1 Junction 28,
Derbyshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011**

Made - - - - *5th August 2011*
Coming into force - - *12th August 2011*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A38 Trunk Road (“the A38”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road and some of those connecting roads, near Little Eaton in the County of Derbyshire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as The A38 Trunk Road (Little Eaton to M1 Junction 28, Derbyshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 12th August 2011.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the northbound carriageway of the A38 from its roundabout junction with the A61, B6179 and Ford Lane (Little Eaton Roundabout) to its roundabout junction with the M1 Junction 28 and the B6019 Mansfield Road;

“a slip road” means the slip road leading to the northbound carriageway of the A38 –

- i) from its junction with the B6179, Derby Road (Coxbench Interchange);
- ii) from its roundabout junction with the A61 and the B6179 (Watchorne Roundabout);
- iii) from its junction with the B600, Abbot Road; and
- iv) from its junction with the road leading to Birchwood Lane;

“layby” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by a road marking of the type

shown in diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002 (a) and partly by the outer edge of that carriageway on the same side of the road as that on which the marking is placed; and in this definition “carriageway” means any way (other than a cycle track) comprised in a length of the trunk road over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a suitable surface for the exercise of that right;

“the works period” means the period starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 15th August 2011 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the trunk road or a slip road.

4. Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in any layby adjacent to the trunk road.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle –

- (i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable; or
- (iii) being used in connection with the said works.
