ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A30 Trunk Road (Honiton to Daisymount Junction)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012**

Made - - - - *10th April 2012*

Coming into force - - *13th April 2012*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A30 Trunk Road (“the A30”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road and two of those connecting roads near Honiton in the District of East Devon in the County of Devon should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A30 Trunk Road (Honiton to Daisymount Junction) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 13th April 2012.

2. In this Order –

“the A30” means the westbound carriageway of the A30 from a point 110 metres west of the centre of its junction with Cheney’s Lane (at Honiton) to a point 380 metres west of the centre of the Daisymount Junction Underbridge;

“the slip roads” mean (i) the westbound entry slip road at the A30 / A35 Langford Junction; (ii) the westbound entry slip road at the A30 Turks Head Junction; and (iii) the westbound entry slip road at the A30 Patteson’s Cross Junction;

“the works” mean resurfacing and maintenance works;

“a works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 16th April 2012 or on any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the A30 and the slip roads.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

(a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;

(a) 1984 c.27; a new section 14 was substituted by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991 (c.26), section 1(1) and Schedule 1.

(b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform;

(c) a vehicle being used for or in connection with the said works.
