ROAD TRAFFIC

The M42 Motorway (Junction 11) (Slip Road) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013

Made - - - 23rd January 2013

Coming into force - - 30th January 2013

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M42 Motorway (“the M42”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on one of those connecting roads in the County of Leicestershire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the M42 Motorway (Junction 11) (Slip Road) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 30th January 2013.

2. In this Order:

“the slip road” means the slip road leading from the southbound carriageway of the M42 at Junction 11;

“the works period” means the period starting at 22.00 hours on Wednesday 6th February 2013 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the slip road.

4. The provisions of articles 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle-

(a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;

(b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or traffic officer in uniform; or

(a) 1984 c.27; a new section 14 was substituted by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991 (c.26), section 1(1) and Schedule 1

(c) being used for or in connection with the said works, or by a traffic officer in uniform.
