**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A46 Trunk Road (Wanlip, Leicestershire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014**

*Made* - - - - - *20th January 2014*  
*Coming into force* - - - *27th January 2014*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A46, and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road and on some of those connecting roads, at Wanlip in the County of Leicestershire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A46 Trunk Road (Wanlip, Leicestershire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on Monday 27th January 2014.
2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means –

- a) the westbound carriageway of the A46 from its roundabout junction with the A607 to its junction with the slip road leading from the roundabout junction with the A6 Loughborough Road;
- b) the eastbound carriageway of the A46 from its junction with the slip road leading to the A6 Loughborough Road to its roundabout junction with the A607;

“a slip road” means the slip road leading –

- a) to the westbound carriageway of the A46 from Wanlip Road;
- b) from the westbound carriageway of the A46 to Fillingate and Rectory Road;
- c) from the westbound carriageway of the A46 to Rectory Road;
- d) to the eastbound carriageway of the A46 from Wanlip;
- e) to the eastbound carriageway of the A46 from Fillingate.

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| “layby”            | means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by a traffic sign of the type shown in diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002 <sup>(a)</sup> and partly by the outer edge of that carriageway on the same side of the road as that on which the sign is placed; and in this definition “carriageway” means any way (other than a cycle track) comprised in a length of the trunk road over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a suitable surface for the exercise of that right; |
| “the works period” | means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 3rd February 2014 and ending when the said works have been completed;  |

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the trunk road or a slip road.

**4.** Subject as mentioned in article 5, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in any layby situated adjacent to the trunk road.

**5.** The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle-

- (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable in uniform; or
- (c) being used for or in connection with the said works.
