**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Jet Formation  
Display Teams) (Amendment) Regulations 2017**

*Made* - - - - - *9th May 2017*

*Coming into force* - - - - - *3rd June 2017*

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict flying by reason of the intended holding of flying displays by jet formation display teams.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

**Citation and commencement**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Jet Formation Display Teams) (Amendment) Regulations 2017 and come into force on 3rd June 2017.

**Amendment**

2. Column 3 of the Schedule to the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Jet Formation Display Teams) Regulations 2017(b) is amended as follows—

- (a) in the entry for Weston-Super-Mare, for “8,100 feet” substitute “8,300 feet”,
- (b) in the entry for Silverstone, for “8,200 feet” substitute “8,600 feet”, and
- (c) in the entry for Marham, for “8,500 feet” substitute “8,300 feet”.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations amend the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Jet Formation Display Teams) Regulations 2017 (S.I. 2017/636) (“the principal Regulations”). The amendment amends the altitudes of the restrictions at Weston-Super-Mare for the display that is scheduled to take place on 17th and 18th June 2017, Silverstone for the display that is scheduled to take place on 16th July 2017 and Marham for the display that is scheduled to take place on 20th July 2017.

Full details of the amendment will be promulgated by Notice to Airmen (NOTAM).
