The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Her Majesty The Queen's Birthday Flypast Rehearsals) (Revocation) Regulations 2018

Made - - - - *at 16:45 hours on 5th June 2018*

Coming into force - - *with immediate effect*

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Southwold, Suffolk and in Norfolk, Cambridgeshire and Lincolnshire by reason of the intended holding of rehearsals of a large formation flypast of aircraft, to commemorate Her Majesty The Queen's Birthday, that are scheduled to take place there.

The rehearsals having now been successfully completed on 5th June 2018, the Secretary of State no longer deems it necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in that area and makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Her Majesty The Queen's Birthday Flypast Rehearsals) (Revocation) Regulations 2018 and come into force with immediate effect.

Revocation of Regulations

2. The following Regulations are revoked—

- (a) The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Her Majesty The Queen's Birthday Flypast) (Rehearsals) Regulations 2018(b)
- (b) Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Her Majesty The Queen's Birthday Flypast) (Amendment) Regulations 2018(c)

EXPLANATORY NOTE
