**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Helicopter Flight)
(Amendment) Regulations 2022**

Made - - - - 20th January 2022

Coming into force - - 23rd January 2022

The Secretary of State has previously decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Greater London, Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire and Norfolk by reason of two intended helicopter flights.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016^(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Helicopter Flight) (Amendment) Regulations 2022 and they come into force on 23rd January 2022.

Amendment

2. The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Helicopter Flight) Regulations 2022^(b) are amended as follows—

- (a) in regulation 3(8) sub paragraph (b) remove “or”,
- (b) in regulation 3(8) sub paragraph (c) after “Airport” delete “.” and insert “, or”,
- (c) in regulation 3(8) insert “(d) Essex Radar.”,
- (d) in regulation 3(9) sub paragraph (c) remove “or”,
- (e) in regulation 3(9) sub paragraph (d) after “Swanwick” delete “.” and insert “, or”, and
- (f) in paragraph 3(9) add “(e) Essex Radar.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Helicopter Flight) Regulations 2022 (S.I. 2022/42). The amendment adds an additional air traffic control unit (Essex Radar) from which a permission to enter into the restricted airspace may be obtained.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Notice to Aviation (NOTAM).
