Sir,

In order to provide for the continued operation of the United States Educational Commission in the United Kingdom established pursuant to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the United States of America signed in London on September 22, 1948,<sup>(1)</sup> I have the honor to propose that the Government of the United Kingdom shall make available for the purposes of the said Agreement by deposit in the United Kingdom in the name of the Treasurer of the United States of a sum in pounds sterling not exceeding the equivalent of \$250,000 in United States currency in amounts and at times requested by the Government of the United States. The sum herein requested is additional to the deposit previously made in accordance with Article 2 of the Agreement and to that made in accordance with the Exchange of Notes of January 20, 1950,<sup>(2)</sup> and October 22, 1952.<sup>(3)</sup> This request is pursuant to the Exchange of Notes of April 28-30, 1952,<sup>(4)</sup> prolonging with modifications the provisions of paragraph 6 of the Joint Statement of 6th December, 1945<sup>(5)</sup> regarding settlement for lend-lease, reciprocal aid, surplus war property and claims.

If the Government of the United Kingdom agrees to the above proposal, I have the honor further to propose that this Note together with your reply in that sense shall constitute an agreement between our respective Governments.
